



Are you someone who is knowledgeable about wildlife in the Chignecto region? This project, led by Dr. Karen Beazley at Dalhousie University, is looking at wildlife movement in the Chignecto Isthmus region. We are interested in learning from your knowledge of wildlife locations, habitat and movement pathways in the region, especially where wildlife exists and moves near and across roads. We are hoping to gather local knowledge about wildlife based on your observations and experience in the region. We think it is an important complement to 'scientific' knowledge, which has many gaps.

Who Can Take Part in the Research Study?

You may participate in this study if you are an adult who knows about and has direct experience with wildlife in the Chignecto Isthmus region, gained by having spent lots of time in the region. This experience may be direct or indirect contact with wildlife- if you have only observed and not interacted with wildlife in the region, you are still a good candidate for this study.

What Will You Be Asked to Do?

For this study, you will be asked to participate in an informal or conversational interview that also includes indicating wildlife locations that you know of on a map of the region. The interview will take 1-2 hours and will occur in July or August of 2019.
